



Holtspur Bank
Local Nature
Reserve



The reserve lies on the north-eastern slope of the Beaconsfield gravel plateau and consists of chalk grassland at the eastern end and woodland to the west. The two habitats are separated by an ancient woodland boundary. There is something interesting to see throughout the year.

Local naturalists conduct guided walks to point out the more unusual plants and animals on the reserve. Dates of walks and other activities are posted in the library, on the site and are listed in the Friends' newsletters.

Access is via footpath 33 from Holtspur Top Lane and from Riding Lane.

The Butterfly Conservation Reserve at Holtspur Bottom is within a few hundred metres, across the valley to the north-west.
