All three girls were in real nappies from about 6 weeks old and were out of them well before 2 years (1st was 22 months, 2nd was 18 months and 3rd just over 16months!!) - all self trained, with absolutely NO stress. I believe that having real nappies helped them be quick potty trainers as they could feel when they were wet and dirty. (See Fact Files 8+9 Toilet Training)

(See Fact Files 8+9 Toilet Training)</p> <p>I am quite relaxed about George's wearing of real nappies, I don't believe it has to be an all or nothing situation, although many people do successfully use them 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, I think it is useful to remember that disposables have a place and I do use them occasionally if we are out for a long day or when we are on holiday.... but every real nappy he wears is one less in the landfill site and I think that is a real incentive and a real achievement.
